Meet our Community Educator

Hello! My name is Leslie Krebs-White and I am the new Community Educator at RCIS. I started in March 2020 and I was able to give two presentations at Westminster High School before the COVID-19 shut down. As you know, it had many of us scrambling and trying to figure out how we are going to provide services. For the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year, I worked on a tool kit with CCPS to distribute to the parents. This toolkit provided information and referrals as well as ways to talk to their child about these sensitive topics. The 2020 -2021 school year has started off virtually and we have all learned to adjust to this new normal. My presentations have been transformed into an interactive virtual format. It is not ideal to be presenting and not seeing students' faces but I am happy to be able to provide this information to them. I will continue to pivot and learn new ways to present to the students at CCPS.

For a forth year, the Community Educator gave presentations in Health classes at all Carroll County Public Middle and High schools. The presentations focus on age-appropriate prevention curriculum.



No experience is required; however, we ask potential volunteers to have a high-school diploma, or equivalency, and the desire to help others.
